## **AGRIMIN SIGNS LAND ACCESS AGREEMENT FOR THE MACKAY PROJECT**

### Highlights

- **Land Access Agreement signed with the Kiwirrkurra people for the Mackay Sulphate of Potash Project in Western Australia**
- **Land Access Agreement covers all five of Agrimin's tenements which make up the Mackay Project area of 2,276km<sup>2</sup>**
- **Agrimin has received strong community support and encouragement from the Kiwirrkurra people for the Mackay Project**

Agrimin Limited (**ASX: GRM**) ("**Agrimin**" or "**the Company**") is pleased to announce it has successfully negotiated and signed a Land Access Agreement ("**LAA**") for the 100% owned Mackay Project with Tjamu Tjamu (Aboriginal Corporation) RNTBC, the Native Title representative body for the Kiwirrkurra people. The negotiations were overseen by Central Desert Native Title Services.

The LAA is an integral step to enable the grant of Agrimin's five tenements within the Kiwirrkurra determination area.

Mark Savich, Executive Director of Agrimin said "This agreement highlights the close working relationship that Agrimin is establishing with the Kiwirrkurra people and their representative body. We are all excited by the high level of encouragement that local communities are providing to Agrimin since it applied for the tenements at Mackay in July this year."

"The Mackay Project has an exciting potential to lead to greatly improved community and employment opportunities for Aboriginal people who live in the region. Agrimin is also committed to working closely with the Aboriginal people to protect and preserve their country and culture."

"For Agrimin, the signing of this LAA is a significant step forward and allows the Company to move ahead with an extensive exploration and development work program at the Mackay Project with the full support and co-operation of the local community."

Bobby West, Chairperson of Tjamu Tjamu (Aboriginal Corporation) on behalf of the Kiwirrkurra people said "We have entered into an agreement today for the Mackay Project and look forward to building a strong and mutually beneficial relationship with Agrimin."

The Mackay Project will now move through the heritage clearance process to allow for tenure to be cleared for on-ground exploration activities. Agrimin is planning a detailed exploration and development work program to commence as early as possible in 2015.

The 2015 work program will include drilling to improve the characterisation of the brine deposit and upgrade the current Inferred Mineral Resource. Drilling will also test the extensions of the deposit which are the basis for the Company's Exploration Target which was announced on 10 November 2014. In addition, other important development information will be collected to allow Agrimin to undertake detailed development studies.
